V. Administrator Report

A. Admin Report

- 1. There were no questions. The Admin Report is very thorough.
- B. Create Ad Hoc committee for HHD curriculum
 - 1. According to DPI, this committee must have a specific make up. Cindy Raimer is working on recruiting the necessary members.
 - Cindy Raimer has been working with a parent who is one semester away
 from being a PA who has been volunteering to evaluate curriculum. GC
 members cannot be on the committee. Katie Popp has volunteered to
 represent the teaching staff. There was one male student who volunteered
 to serve on the committee.

C. Para Job Share

1. Laura Wollersheim has requested a job share to meet her time commitments. Hired Jennifer Sapiro.

D. Internal substitute pay for paras

- Due to struggles procuring substitute teachers last school year to meet the unique needs of the school, it was suggested that an incentive be offered to encourage paraprofessionals to seek and obtain their substitute teaching license.
 - a. One option could be for the Governance Council to pay for the cost of the license (~\$270) for each paraprofessional that gets it with the understanding that there be a commitment to continue to work at ROLES for a set amount of time to recoup the outlay.
 - Another option would be to increase the substitute teacher pay (currently \$15.00/hour), which is less than the paraprofessionals typically make.
 - c. Paraprofessional sub pay is \$14.00/hour.
 - d. Tera Rogers recommends that the Governance Council work with CESA 6 to set a DAILY sub rate vs the HOURLY sub rate model we currently use.
 - e. No decision on the incentive was reached. The options will be further evaluated and a recommendation made at a future meeting, tentatively in September.

VI. Covid Protocol for 22-23

- A. Tera Rogers presented findings that many of the local districts are following CDC guidelines. This year, most are not going to require household contacts to isolate unless they are symptomatic. Most districts are not going to require masking. Parents and staff need clarification on what ROLES will be doing this year.
- B. Todd Bugnacki suggested that as this is an issue that impacts the day-to-day operations of the school, it would be best for Cindy Raimer to meet with the staff and determine what best meets the needs of the school community. Cindy Raimer will work with Amy Levash to communicate a plan for the upcoming school year with the understanding that it is subject to change as the situation evolves.

VIII. Lynden Art/Music Curriculum

- A. Cindy Raimer reported that Jade Cashman's daughters have attended the Lynden Sculpture Garden's Art and Music programs and have very positive reports. She reached out to Polly at the Lynden Sculpture Garden and was presented with a quote for \$10,000 to cover the cost of curriculum for the program, and professional development for the staff. The curriculum would cover all six grade levels at ROLES.
- B. For approximately another \$5,000, we would be able to purchase supplies for the program as well.
- C. For approximately \$5,000 more, their staff could help us select and install a kiln on campus.
- D. The initial fee would also allow for ROLES to bring the students to the Lynden Sculpture Garden for a field trip, provided ROLES pays for the transportation costs.
- E. Korinne Haeffel will look into the kiln a little bit more before we vote on purchasing a kiln. She needs to verify that Riveredge is supportive of the purchase and has a safe place to install and use the equipment.
