 - B. Ami Rosengren Two models were discussed. They were basically the same except the homerooms were different. Split homerooms or graded homerooms. Prefers to have the 4th graders kept together. Worried about the new teacher coming in and having to teach different classes.

- C. Sarah Neumann Echoing Ami's question. Came across entirely differently during the meeting and the one slide didn't reflect what was discussed. Keep the classes together. 4th together and 3&5th together. She says the comments in the shared document were different. If we jumble all the grades together, she fears that a lot of families will pull.
- D. Sara Tippet Has a 3rd grader and a 5th grader. New to the school. Very concerned about both of her children due to having completely different needs academically. Understand the 4th grade not wanting to be broken apart. Doesn't want to limit future enrollment, however. More in favor of an abilities-based configuration. She would like additional information on exactly what the differences are. Much more comfortable with an abilities -based separation.
- E. Jessica Koepsell 3rd Grader and Kindergartner. Is Servais going to remain the 4th grade teacher and the new teacher responsible for the 3rd and 5th? She thinks it might be better to have an experienced teacher with the 3rd and 5th. Both models mentioned spending time in the classroom, does that mean less time outside. Are we still going to have access to the yurts and the building or just those spaces?
- F. Tera Rogers 4th grade parent. Harrison has been with the school since day one and had an amazing experience. Biggest concern is the peer-groups. Understands the academic groups, but feel that we need to consider the kids. Worry about potential negative impact on their relationships. Her son loves the relationships very much and she worries that if we merge the 3 grade levels that too many families will leave. Strongly encourages us to allow these kids to stay together.
- G. Cindy Raiimer detailed the two homeroom models and clarified some of the questions:
 - 1. We will have both yurts and the building to split between the two homerooms per the facilities use agreement.
 - 2. Classes will still have the same opportunities to be outside.
- H. Diane asked if the classes, no matter the model, would still be collaborative for some subjects.
 - Korinne asked how would the 4th grade maintain their tight knit group in either model?
 - 1. If they are in a homeroom of 4thh graders only, they will be intermingled for sure for reading and math, and there are still opportunities for intermingling in other subjects.
- J. Adam asked what amount of time will they be intermingled:
 - 1. Cindy responded that for sure it would be 1.5 hours for math and 1 hour for reading and then as the teachers seek to collaborate.
- K. Cindy addressed the question about whether or not Mrs. Servais would teach 4th grade, but that decision hasn't been made.
